

Greer's project increased One Roof's capacity to serve youth and young adults who are experiencing homelessness. As the Homeless Continuum of Care for Central Alabama, One Roof coordinates 45+ partner agencies serving individuals who are homeless. Greer worked with these partner agencies and outside institutions—like the child welfare and justice systems—to streamline their prevention and intervention efforts.

Some of his project outcomes include the following:

 A Youth Homelessness Needs Assessment Report was produced, including a quantitative and qualitative analysis of primary and secondary data (e.g., Census data, Homeless Management Information System data) not previously assembled specifically for youth



# **Hadiyah Page**

2020-21 ASF Fellow for Life Community Site Partner: Impact Family Counseling Academic Mentor: Dr. Christianne Strange Site Mentor: LaCrecia Day

Hadiyah sought to address the impacts that trauma, such as exposure to gun violence, has on youth by using the expressive arts as an outlet. She used various artistic mediums as a way for 7th-9th graders at Tarrant High School to identify and express their emotions and to set goals for their future selves.

Some of her project outcomes include the following:

- 17 students improved conflict resolution skills and felt more resilient when facing school and interpersonal challenges
- 26 students had a positive self-image
